ACTION GRANT PROGRAM

Please read these instructions before completing the application.

Eligible Applicants

Teachers, nature center personnel and youth group leaders in Illinois may apply.

Eligible Projects

Projects must emphasize student/youth involvement with planning, development and maintenance and increase the educational and wildlife habitat values of the site. The applicant must be prepared to maintain and commit resources to the project for at least five years. The project must be implemented on school grounds or another public place (for example, a park or nature center/forest preserve district land). Plans that include vegetation should use native species. If you are not sure what species are native to Illinois, please visit the Web site at <http://dnr.state.il.us/education/CLASSRM/grants.htm> for links to more information and resources. Habitat projects may include, but not be limited to, the following activities: enhance or establish and maintain a schoolyard prairie plot, butterfly garden, rain garden, wetland, nesting platform or watering station; design and build a bird feeder or feeding station; or construct and install bat roosting boxes. Vegetable gardens are not eligible for this grant.

Applications

Incomplete applications will not be considered. Responses should be typed in standard 12-point font, single-spaced with one-inch margins on each side of the page (exceptions are noted in the application questions). **The original application PLUS three copies of it and all attachments must be submitted.** Applications must be postmarked by November 30, 2012. Applications will be evaluated by a committee, and the committee will make all decisions regarding funding. Evaluation judging criteria will include but not be limited to: detailed information, including goals and objectives; student involvement; relationships of the project to school or organizational curricula or objectives; project creativity and design; benefit to wildlife; habitat project management plan. **ALL** applications must include a completed and signed W-9 form. <http://www.irs.gov/>

Eligible Costs

Funding requests should focus on items necessary for enhancement and development of wildlife habitat, such as native plants, seeds, mulch and lumber/hardware for constructing nesting/roosting boxes and platforms.

Ineligible Costs

Ineligible costs include, but are not limited to, the following items: consultant fees, bird seed, fuel, equipment, equipment rental, signs, labor, books, Web site development, land acquisition, chemicals (fertilizer, herbicides, pesticides, insecticides).

Use of Chemicals

According to the Illinois Pesticide Act, a pesticide license is required of **anyone** applying pesticides in a public space (minimum age to receive a license is 16 years). If you are considering applying any type of pesticide (herbicide, insecticide, fungicide) to your habitat area, please contact the Illinois Department of Agriculture at 1-800-641-3934 for further information.

Project Time Line

The project must be completed before November 30, 2013.

Application packet: postmarked by November 30, 2012

Notification to all applicants: by February 1, 2013

Submission of final report: by November 30, 2013

Funding and Payment

The maximum annual award is \$1,000 per applicant. Funds are provided on a reimbursement basis. Only purchases approved by the grant committee from the original application will be reimbursed. Successful applicants are eligible to apply for additional funding in subsequent years. Generous donations from the Jadel Youth Fund, the Daniel F. and Ada L. Rice Foundation and others help make this program possible. Grants from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services' (USFWS) Partners for Fish and Wildlife Program and the USFWS Chicago Ecological Services Office in support of the *Youth in the Great Outdoors Initiative* to employ, educate and engage young people in exploring, connecting with and preserving America's natural and cultural heritage, also provide funding for the program. A grant from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Environmental Education Grant Program has also been received to support this program.

Reporting Requirements

Students should be involved with development of the final report. The final report may be submitted electronically on a CD-ROM or as a hard copy. The final report should contain information on how students were involved with the project and educational opportunities the habitat provides. Before-and-after photos or photos of the schoolyard site and/or students working in the habitat should be included in this report. Each project coordinator should submit a few photographs that can be utilized in marketing the program. Photograph release forms will be provided by the Illinois Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) and should be signed and returned with the photographs. Original receipts for purchases must be submitted. Additional information on reporting requirements will be provided to successful grant recipients.

Publicity

Successful grant recipients will be required to acknowledge the funding sources in any project publicity or printed materials produced. Details will be provided in the acceptance letter.

The original application plus three copies of it (all pages, including attachments) must be submitted and postmarked by **NOVEMBER 30, 2012**. A completed and signed W-9 form is also required. The application should be no more than four pages in length (excluding the photo and diagram pages), single spaced. Use standard layout (12-point font and 1” margins). **PLEASE NOTE:** You must include the question and its associated number from the application form with your answers.

Describe the proposed project by addressing each point.

1. a. In 30 words or less describe the proposed project (who, what, where, when, how).
b. What are the goal(s) and measurable objectives of the project?
2. How are students involved? What age or grade levels? How is the community involved?

Note: For question 3, school sites/groups please answer only part a; youth groups or non-school sites please answer only part b.

3. a. Describe how the project will enhance the educational use of the area. Please include connections to school curricula, Illinois Learning Standards, ecological concepts to be covered and any resulting products (lesson plans, student reports, etc.).
b. If this is a non-school site or youth group, provide the mission of the organization and its goals and how they relate to the project. Describe how the site will be used in your activities and if/how local schools will be involved. Include any resulting student products to be created with the project.
4. Describe how the proposed project will affect wildlife/habitat and students and tell how you will educate the community about the project and its goals/objectives (media, open house, Web site, etc.).
5. A long-term care/maintenance plan for the project is imperative.
 - a.) How will the area be managed or maintained during project development, during the school year, during the summer and in subsequent years?
 - b.) Who specifically will be responsible and what will be the roles of school administrators, students, school custodial staff and community volunteers? Will long-term funding be required to maintain the area? Who will provide necessary funds?
